Undergraduates major in architecture or those who have basic knowledge about architecture are welcomed. For those who are not architecture major, please specify your knowledge about architecture in the personal statement. Upon completion of this program, you will receive a transcript, a certificate of completion of study, and up to 4.5 units of credit from Tianjin University.

## Module Two : Chinese Economy and Market

Upon completion of this program, you will receive a report, a certificate of completion of study, and up to 5.5 units of credit from Tianjin University.

### Refund Policy:

All withdrawal before 30 days from (exclude day 30, GMT+8) the start date of the program with valid reasons, accommodation fee, field trip fee and 50% of the administration fee (exclude bank charge) will be refunded. However, the registration fee and tuition/internship fee are non-refundable. If the participant withdraws within 30 days away from the event start date, the program fee (including registration fee, tuition/ internship fee, accommodation fee, administration fee, field trip fee) is non-refundable.

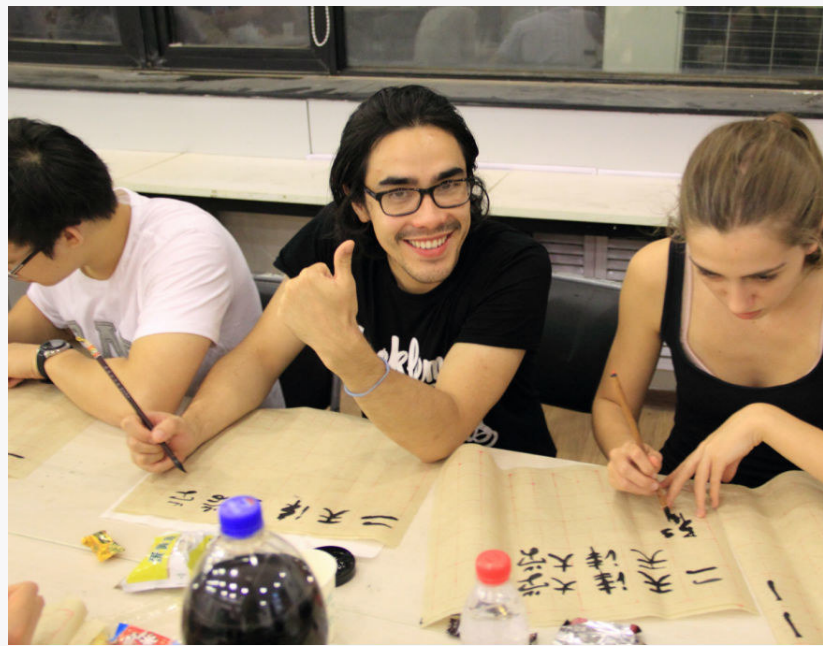

## Brief Introduction to Tianjin University

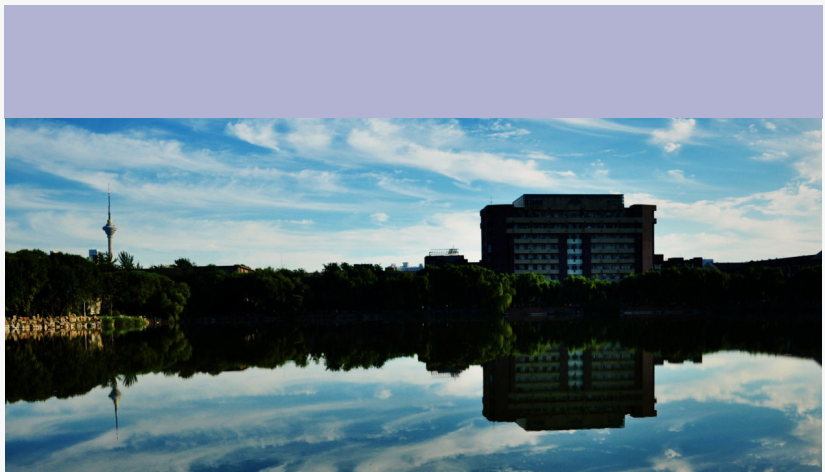
Tianjin University, established in 1895 as Peiyang University, is the first university in China. Over 118 years, more than 200,000 students have studied at the university and have made great contributions in every walk of life. TU has been a National Key University since 1959 when the first 16 universities were so designated by the government. It is also among the first group of universities to be included into the "211" and "985" Projects of national investment for developing world class universities. Now, TU has grown into a world recognized research university with distinctive quality and strength in education, research and social service.



TU has one of the most active on-campus communities in China. Every student and faculty is proud to be a member in this big family and is respectful towards each other. A variety of extracurricular activities are offered through dozens of student groups and organizations such as Peiyang Arts Troupe, Youth Volunteer Association and many other clubs around campus. They offer social events such as the Weekend Concert, Robot Festival and so on. The campus provides a unique and supportive environment in which student can learn and grow while enjoying campus life.

# Appendix

## The City of Tianjin



Tianjin (Chinese: 天津) is a metropolis in northern China and one of the five national central cities of the People's Republic of China (PRC). It is governed as one of the four direct-controlled municipalities of the PRC, and is thus under direct administration of the central government. Tianjin borders Hebei Province and Beijing Municipality, bounded to the east by the Bohai Gulf portion of the Yellow Sea. Part of the Bohai Economic Rim, it is the largest coastal city in northern China.

In terms of urban population, Tianjin is the fourth largest in China, after Shanghai, Beijing, and Guangzhou. Tianjin is a dual-core city, with its main urban area (including the old city) located along the Hai River, which connects to the Yellow and Yangtze Rivers via the Grand Canal; and Binhai, a New Area urban core located east of the old city, on the coast of Bohai Sea. As of the end of 2010, around 285 Fortune 500 companies have set up base in Binhai, which is a new growth pole in China and is a hub of advanced industry and financial activity. Since the mid-19th century, Tianjin has been a major seaport and gateway to the nation's capital.

Tianjin Port is ranked in top 10 in the world's largest ports according to throughput capacity and is the largest man-made port in China.
